“Religion and the Presidency”

At the November 8th UU Fellowship service, Professor John Blakeman will discuss how religion affects presidential policymaking. He will discuss historical examples of how the religious faith of specific presidents has affected public policy, and how longer term religious developments in society have likewise affected presidential politics.

John Blakeman is an Associate Professor and Department Chair, at UWSP Dept of Political Science. He received his PhD from the University of Virginia. His Masters Degree at the London School of Economics and a BA at Wake Forest University. Professor Blakeman has been at UWSP for 6 years and prior to that, Baylor University in Texas.
